As a result of the expansion, the school has had a 5% increase in student numbers between 2017/18 and 2018/2019. With each new intake, the school will be replacing a smaller number of children from a smaller catchment area with a larger number children from a slightly larger catchment area, which will affect our survey numbers, especially as the survey is done in October before any of our measures can have an impact on new families (who will probably on average live further away than families of children who have moved on).
