Remote Learning

Our ongoing research and experience in remote learning is increasingly showing us the positive impact of the recorded lessons in terms of access, engagement and quality of learning. However, we will continue to try and offer a range of different opportunities for your child to engage with their learning but our emphasis will always be on the quality of teaching and learning as it would be if the children were here with us in school. The Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) states that the characteristics of good teaching are far more important than the medium of delivery. The most important thing is that we consider how to transfer into remote learning what we already know about effective teaching in the classroom. This is backed by the OFSTED guidance published on 11th January 2021. As always our prime aim is to deliver a high-quality curriculum so that the children know more and remember more.






What's been going on this week?

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Year 4

Lots of fabulous creative work from the Year 4 children this week as we have continued with our study of Japan. In geography we looked at the importance of seasons in the country and continued this study in art where we painted cherry blossom. In RE we learnt about the two main religions in Japan: Shintoism and Buddhism. Everyone made origami cranes which symbolise good luck. Year 5

Another busy week of learning in Year 5! This week we have continued our Science focus on the topic of materials. The children have been able to carry out experiments at home to investigate processes such as dissolving, where the children added salt to water to create a solution. They either used water of various temperatures to see if this dissolved the salt faster, or stirred the water to test if this had an impact on how quickly the salt would dissolve. You can see Daisy carrying out her experiment here. We also investigated the possibility to extracting the salt back from the solution it has created. We did this by leaving a small amount of the solution to evaporate and recorded daily what has happened to it. See Oscar's (far left) and Arthur's (bottom right) experiments here.

Year 6

In Year 6 this week the children have been busy investigating how light travels and the angles at which it is reflected in a mirror. They produced some very accurate diagrams to show what they had discovered. As part of their geography, the children made information posters on football teams whose development and history is closely linked to the industries in their local areas. The teachers have also been impressed by some excellent examples of the use of figurative language in the children's written work.

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
